# Programs of Study/Career Pathways

- A program of study for each career pathway is a coherent, articulated sequence of rigorous academic and career/technical courses including dual credit opportunities, leading to postsecondary degrees and industry recognized certifications and/or licensures.
- Career Pathways are developed, implemented and maintained in partnership among secondary and postsecondary institutions, business and employers. They are available to all students, including adult learners and are designed to lead to rewarding careers.



# Purposes of the Perkins Act

- Improve Career & Technical Education
- Assist in keeping the U.S. competitive in a global economy
- Establish challenging standards for high wage, high skill occupations
- Integrate academic and technical instruction with a link to postsecondary training
- Support partnerships between education and industry

# Kentucky's Allocation

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- FY 2016 \$17,905,647
  - Basic Grant (85%) = \$15,219,800
  - Leadership (10%) = \$1,790,565
  - Administration (5%) = \$895,282
- By state statute the KWIB is responsible for determining the allocations of Leadership funds.
