


#### History, Intent, How & Results





## 2021 Results

## 2022 Preliminary Results

- 202 Completed Participants
- 60+ Employer Partners
- Self-Reported Survey Results (N=77) as of 8/24/2022
  - The internship program helped them feel more connected to their community 90%
  - The training opportunities were available 77%
  - The PA Mentor was a valuable part of their experience 82%
  - The program helped them learn more about career opportunities in their home community -86%
  - They have a better plan for what they would like to do after they finish their education or training - 81%
  - They learned more about the resources available to them locally through their CAAs 90%
  - So far, 47% of the respondents say they are interested in a career in the healthcare related field.
