

- 39 Member Board (51% business and Industry makeup at a minimum)






Green Light Given by Governor Beshear's Office in February to Proceed with Strategic Plan



### 2:02pm Call Meeting to Order / Welcome

**Amy Luttrell, co-chair,** called the meeting to order and briefly walked through the goals for the meeting.

- ➤ **Group Introductions** Amy identified, by name, the Workforce Participation and Sustainability (WP & S) committee members and with whom they were affiliated. She asked the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board (KWIB) staff to share the committee list with its members after the meeting.
- ➤ Role of KWIB and WP&S Committee Amy walked through the KWIB purpose: serves as an advisory board to the Governor on workforce training and development issues; charged with creating a statewide vision for workforce development and adopting a plan to move Kentucky forward through workforce training and development; board comprised of a

minimum of 51% business and industry). This committee is in place to assist the work of the board and drive initiatives behind the goals within the Strategic Plan, approved by the Governor.

- ➤ Committee activities to date Amy talked about the committee goals that include: strengthening the collaboration among workforce entities, employers and social service entities; identify and mitigate disincentives to work; promote workforce participation for all underrepresented populations; promote strategies to address employment barriers; increase the number of drug-free Kentuckians.
- ➤ Recent initiatives include identifying and spreading awareness of priority populations; identifying the barriers by population; creating a benefit cliff calculator; creating a self-sustainability calculator; youth and young adult's taskforce.

The Kentucky Center for Statistics (KY Stats), working with the National Center for Children in Poverty (NCCP), has created tools to addressing disincentives to work (loss of benefits). These tools are also valuable to job assisting agencies and lawmakers. This tool and a basic needs budget calculator are found at <a href="https://kystats.ky.gov/Reports/FRS">https://kystats.ky.gov/Reports/FRS</a>. Heidi Margulis heads a sub-committee that is working on the communication and training of these tools.

### ➤ What has changed since Covid-19 & what has remained constant?

Identified populations and barriers have not changed with the COVID virus. Jobs have changed and noticeably, women have had to leave the workforce to care for children and/or to homeschool. Those in the workforce close to retirement have left and are not returning, if they can draw on unemployment benefits or other state benefits. Through data analysis, policy recommendation and collaboration with state, and local entities we can identify and address measures to increase the participation of Kentucky's workforce.

### > Future Committee Priorities – Open Discussion

Amy asked the committee to share ideas; those offered include:

- Review the landscape of conducting business has changed; buildings sit empty;
   there is a domino effect on industry that has not fully materialized (restaurants, service, etc.)
- focus on changing policy to adapt to the needs of the populations in the state
- **internet challenges** in the state need a fast and effective solution to serve all regions of Kentucky (east KY is most vulnerable)
- internet inconsistency and childcare needs
- affordable **broadband for educators** to serve children
- labor market has shifted; colleges are not physically pulling in students from other states; could see a shortfall in future labor market participants
- Career Centers capacity review to assist the needs (possible growing needs)
- What incentives are in place to offset barriers? Are they the right ones?

- **Submit grants** to offset state or regional cost (currently working on RETAIN within the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet (EWDC)
- Locally or regional partnering with employers apprenticeships or training for "tomorrow's workforce" (ex: northern ky and use of the airport to train for positions)
- Mental health issues increasing because of workforce landscape (impacted by COVID)
- Survey those populations most affected by COVID; what are they saying?
- Review of existing federal (WIOA) and state dollars and appropriate them where the need is greatest (east KY, other regions?)
- Pilot programs (success from TeleWorks and others in regions with unique issues) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OytFmYg6xbE
- Increase skills and training in upcoming fields (tech fields)
- Revamp KY's economic development for the future
- Find a way for those living in east KY to work from their without having to leave for a "brick and mortar" facility (increase abilities for remote working)

Amy asked that KWIB staff send the slide deck and list of committee members to the committee. Next steps are to compile these ideas and set up next meeting in the coming weeks.
