

Beth Engle opened the meeting and shared the agenda with the committee. She shared the omission in the originally attached preread and referred the group to the updated preread with the corrected applications listed.

She walked through current team members and shared the CTE Certification submission process. Information on the process can be found here. Beth shared that the Business Education Alignment Taskforce (BEAT) teams thoroughly review the applications and recommend (or do not) movement on to the next level for approval. Regan Satterwhite provided additional information around the process.

There was discussion around if the programs were approved or not. Regan Satterwhite affirmed that these four (4) were not approved by the BEAT. The working group must confirm their agreement to follow the BEAT guidance through a vote. If they group agrees no further action is required.

Scott Pierce motioned to agree with the BEAT decision. **Matt Bacon seconded** the motion to agree with the BEAT decision. None were opposed. The motion carried unanimously.

Debbie Dennison, KWIB, thanked everyone for their time, input, and questions and shared that this year is state plan year for each state. A state plan is required to be completed every four years to help drive the nation's workforce. The Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board Team and partners have been going to hearing sessions in the 10 areas. She shared the upcoming sessions and encouraged the committee to attend.
