POLICY NAME: Electronic Power of Attorney Documents – Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) Program

HISTORY: Initially issued January 1, 2021; reissued March 1, 2023 with no substantive change, thus effective date remains.

PURPOSE: Department of the Treasury Internal Revenue Service Form 2848 (Power of Attorney and Declaration of Representative) is used to authorize an individual to represent a taxpayer before the IRS; the individual authorized must be eligible to practice before the IRS. The authorization of a qualifying representative will also allow that individual to receive and inspect taxpayer confidential tax information.

Currently, the Kentucky WOTC program accepts original notarized Power of Attorney documents only. A power of attorney with a general reference is unacceptable. A valid power of attorney must have the description of the matter, the tax form number, and the year(s) or period(s) where applicable. Representation is only applicable for the years or periods listed on Form 2848.
