2:01 PM MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Welcome and Overview

Whitney Allen, Commissioner, Kentucky Department of Veteran Affairs (KDVA), greeted everyone and thanked them for attending. He emphasized the importance of resources for veterans, their families, and military personnel. Commissioner Allen then outlined the meeting's agenda, highlighting the upcoming discussion on next steps reviewing the resources and creating a strategic plan.

Group Goal Overview:

Alisher Burikhanov, Executive Director, Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board (KWIB), reviewed the list of military resources received during the previous task force meeting. He explained that suggestions received had been categorized. He asked for the group if there were any significant gaps to address. He expressed interest in feedback on how to best use these resources.

Vetting resource credibility and relevance was raised. Commissioner Allen stressed that the list served as a tool and guide. The Commissioner emphasized the need for accurate and relevant information. Members were asked to contribute additional resources across all 120 counties. Commissioner Allen began a walkthrough of the listed resources. Suggestions were made to streamline resource naming and improve clarity on areas served.

Several adjustments were recommended for specific entries, including updating contact information and removing irrelevant resources. Questions arose regarding the inclusion of certain organizations, with a decision made to remove those not directly relevant or located in Kentucky.

A taskforce member questioned the broad scope of services provided by certain organizations, but it was decided that organizations that offer services listed in several categories should remain in the category reflecting their primary objective(s).

After completing the revisions and considering suggestions, Commissioner Allen proposed allowing one more week for review and to ensure that the document is updated by 03/28/2024.

Group Discussion:

Commissioner Allen shared the KDVA Strategic Plan template outlining framework items to consider their next steps.

Commissioner Allen asked for the group's ideas regarding a strategic plan that should align with the Governor's plans and in support of the Education and Labor Cabinet initiatives. He added the need to clarify the vision and identify what success looks like. He asked the group to consider its strengths as well as what needs improvement. He gave an example of the recruitment efforts with VALOR and aligning them to other state veteran recruitment initiatives. He stated that we have a pool of passionate individuals and opportunities in various sectors, as well as a supportive administration. However, we also face threats from other states that may be performing better in certain areas.

Commissioner Allen would like to use the plan template as the taskforce's next meeting agenda and to establish clear objectives and goals during that time. His goal would be to create a solid draft of the plan by mid-June.

Commissioner Allen reiterated his desire to have significant progress within a month. A template will be provided to the taskforce members within a week.

Immediate Objectives to Accomplish and Next Steps

Commissioner Allen emphasized the need to organize resources, create a strategic plan, and determine where to store lists, stressing the importance of sticking to an aggressive timeline. As part of this timeline, updates to the <u>resource guide</u> must be completed by March 28, 2024. Commissioner Allen thanked the taskforce members for their valuable contributions and participation. Next meeting is scheduled for April 25, 2024, from 2pm-3:30pm EDT.
