CALL TO ORDER AT 10:31AM

Johnny Pittman, Chair of Opportunity Youth, Young Adults (OYYA)

Johnny began the meeting with a moment of silence on behalf of Dr. Julie Whitis who passed and was involved in this mission.

Statement of Purpose

He then provided an overview of this working group: to establish a toolkit for employers to understand rules, policies, terminology for youth to engage in understanding or employment within an occupation or industry.

Pre-read / WBL Discussion

Discussion occurred around terminology and use. What is a toolkit? Does that have any resonance with the business community? Implementation guide may have a more universal understanding among business owners. There were two pre-read WBL resource guides provided in the invitation – one from IN and one from TN. Johnny asked what folks liked and didn't like about the resources.

The group liked that there was a guide but concerns around translating the policies into vernacular that business-owners could understand was raised. They also lifted that engagement and outreach will be critical in conveying value of this resource.

<u>Connecting business with schools / districts – Best practices; Learning Grove, Northern KY</u>
Johnny Pittman introduced Kathy Burkhard and Lorraine O'Moore from Northern Kentucky.
They are a part of the Learning Grove, who nurture lifelong learning success. Information about the company can be found at https://www.learning-grove.org/

Lorraine began the conversation they're model which includes 3-E's: Exposure, Experience and Education.

They are able to serve a racially and socioeconomically diverse population of nearly 7,000 children, youth, and families annually with programs across Northern Kentucky and Southwest Ohio.

They have programs that support children and students, parents and families and businesses and community. Through invitation and collaboration, they are bringing employers in the area to the table, walking through a process that has been created and better understanding how to introduce youth to business / industry options / opportunities.

Next Steps:

- Work-Based Learning "Implementation Guide"
 - Invite Michelle DeJohn, Office of Employer and Apprenticeship Services (OEAS) to be part of the working group. Resource for what KDE is currently pulling together as a guidebook. (Completed - she will be joining us going forward)
 - Lorraine asked to be invited to upcoming CTE Certification Review meetings (Completed)
 - Smaller group gather a compendium of definitions used to refer to Work-Based Learning opportunities by different federal, state, and local agencies. The overlap of definitions is something we have to overcome if we are to be successful.
 - Identify pieces to keep from collected and similar toolkits in the region: what is missing/what can be improved?
 - Create an outline / table of contents of the guide
 - List of educational programs / facilities to target
 - List of employers to target
